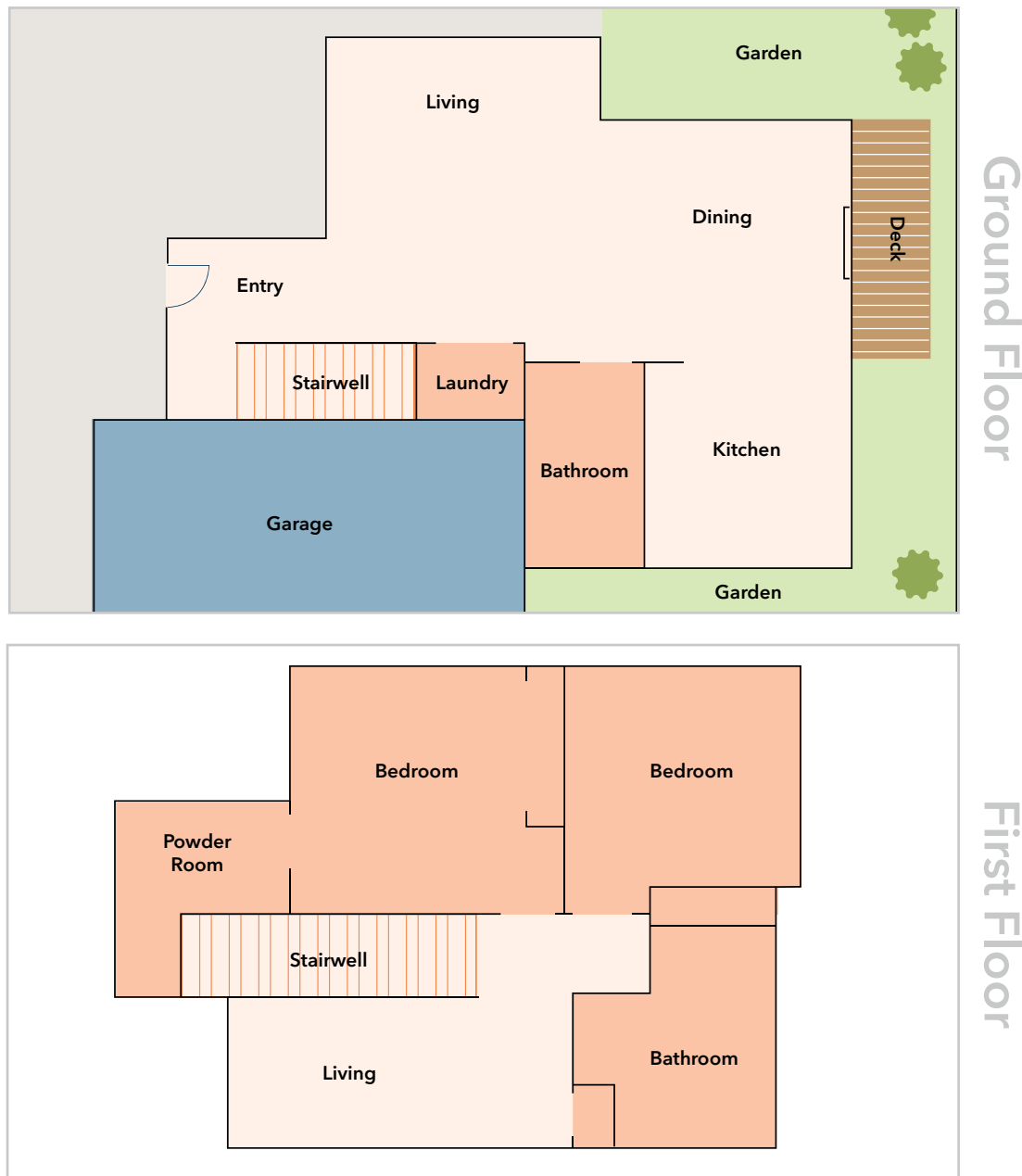

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA)?

Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) refers to specially designed housing for people with support needs. SDA funding covers the cost of the home.

What is Supported Independent Living (SIL)?

Supported Independent Living (SIL) helps people with disability live as independently as possible in their own home. This includes support with daily activities such as personal care, cooking, cleaning, developing independent living skills and overnight support.

Do I need both SDA and SIL funding?

If you live in an SDA property, you will need SDA funding in your NDIS plan which covers the accommodation. SIL funding is separate and covers the supports you receive while living there. Not all SIL homes are SDA properties, therefore you can receive SIL funding on its own, and utilise this for a SIL home.

How do I know if I'm eligible for SDA funding?

SDA funding is available to some NDIS participants. Eligibility is assessed by the NDIS based on your support requirements, and long-term housing needs.

How can I check if SDA or SIL is included in my NDIS plan?

You can check your NDIS plan or speak with your Support Coordinator, Local Area Coordinator (LAC), or NDIS Planner. They can help confirm what funding you have and whether an application or reassessment is required.

Can The Bridge help me understand my options?

Yes. The Bridge offers both SIL services and SDA properties. Our team can help you understand your NDIS funding, explore suitable housing options, and support you through the next steps.
